15/021 Declaration of Interest in Agenda items

Cllr Pickles declared a pecuniary interest in PA15/00955 & PA15/00304 (neighbour).

15/022 Police Liaison

PCSO Burgess in attendance, written report circulated.

10 recorded crimes this month up to 24th February 2015.

The police are continuing to liaise with the schools regarding inconsiderate parking and also continuing to monitor Higher Fraddon.

15/023 Public Session

No issues.

Chairman moved SO 6a to allow public speaking, agreed.

15/024 Planning Applications

Cllr Pickles left the room.

a. Planning Applications.

i. <u>PA15/00955</u> Land At Pines Tip Summercourt Newquay Cornwall. Installation of three wind turbines with a maximum height of 70m to tip, electrical switch station, crane hardstandings, site access, onsite access tracks, underground cabling, temporary construction compound and ancillary infrastructure.

A member of the public stated he had a petition, with at least 50 signatures on it, objecting to this application, which he will be forwarding to Cornwall Council. Another resident objected to the application on noise, heritage assets (only explored up to 10km), residential amenity and significant visual effects. She stated the Grade 1 listed buildings were disguised in the application. Concerns regarding the cumulative map, which had scoped out turbines.

A resident from Pedna Carne emphasised that this is a Residential Park, and they were concerned with the extra traffic.

Proposal by Cllr Morcom to object to the application on cumulative visual impact, visual impact on heritage buildings, noise & loss of amenity for the nearby residents, adverse landscape impact and concerns regarding installing turbines on an unstable surface (it hasn't been proven it can be done from an engineering perspective). We would reference Cornwall Councils refusal of Trenithon, Chytane and Fentonladock and the subsequent appeal officers' dismissals of Fentonladock, Chytane, Beacon Road, Degenbris and Nancolleth as these all reference cumulative visual impact, noise and impacts on local churches amongst other concerns.

In the response to the recent Neighbourhood Plan questionnaire 76% of the residents opposed wind turbines in the Parish & 65% opposed any further turbines in mid- Cornwall. A Community Benefit Payment is expected, if the proposal is approved, proportionate to size & type of installation in line with other Parishes in Cornwall, with as few restrictions as possible so it can be used for the Community's benefit, seconded Cllr Brawn, 4 for 1 abstention, carried.

The above was duly resolved.

 PA15/00304 Burthy Row Farm Summercourt Newquay Cornwall TR8 5BP. Levelling of unproductive agricultural land to improve quality, drainage and agricultural productivity.

Applicant & agent present.

Proposal by Cllr Bunyan to support the application, seconded Cllr Morcom, 4 for 1 abstention, carried.

The above was duly resolved.

Cllr Pickles re-entered the room.

iii. PA15/01122 Land North East Of Little Gaverigan Indian Queens Cornwall. The removal of the existing Vodafone only 17.7m mast housing 3 antennas and 1 x 0.3m dish and its replacement with a 17.5m mast housing 6 antennas, 3 x 0.3m dishes for the shared use of Telefonica and Vodafone. 1 cabinet to be removed and 2 installed. Proposal by Cllr Morcom to support the application, seconded Cllr Pickles, 5 for 1 abstention, carried.

The above was duly resolved.

iv. <u>PA15/01282</u> Bodanna Farm, Summercourt. Continued use of land for stationing of residential mobile home for horticultural manager/ owner.

Applicant present.

Proposal by Cllr Pickles to support the application, seconded Cllr Morcom, 5 for 1 abstention, carried.

The above was duly **resolved.**

Cllr Cole as Cornwall Councillor did not vote on the above applications.

Cllr Cole reported the Kelliers delay is due to landfill issues; Cornwall Council are waiting the Environment Agency to sign off the land.

The builder has visited the site and recommended the building is washed with hydrochloride solution, ClIr Brawn offered to supply this FOC to the Handyman along with a COSHH sheet. The building will then need painting with a clear anti-fungal paint. Proposal by ClIr Brawn to approve this, seconded ClIr Bunyan, carried. The above was duly **resolved**.

15/029 Old St Enoder Cemetery

a. To award Tender.

6 Tenders received; tender envelopes opened at the meeting and tenders passed to Vice- Chairman.

Proposal by Cllr Cole to accept the second cheapest (Keith Pritchard) Tender at £800 for remedial work & £1,600 per annum for maintenance, to ensure the job will be done well, seconded Cllr Morcom, unanimous.

The above was duly resolved.

Concerns were raised over the cheapest Tender as it was substantially cheaper than all the other Tenders.

b. To agree additional remedial work not included on Tender.

Clerk circulated additional work needed for consideration.

Painting of gate- to instruct the Handyman to complete.

Topple test of headstones; it was **agreed** the Clerk write to the Church to ask when the headstones were last topple tested and their plans for future maintenance. To also contact Kerrow Memorials for a quote for the topple test; re-agenda for the March meeting.

15/030 Cornwall 4 Change-update to members & to discuss supporting.

Written report circulated with the agenda.

Cllr Pickles explained it mainly centred on planning issues. Discussion took place regarding pros and cons of officially supporting the group.

The Clerk informed members a letter had been received by CALC from Cornwall 4 Change stating St Enoder Parish Council supports them (it was a list of approx. 60 Councils of which we were 1).

Proposal by Cllr Brawn to respond to Cornwall 4 Change that St Enoder Parish Council do not wish to be formal supporters but would appreciate the opportunity to attend meetings as observers, seconded Cllr Pickles, carried.

The above was duly resolved.

15/031 Indian Queens Play Area- fence breaking, to review quote for temporary repair.

Quote circulated with agenda.

This is for a pvc coated fence to be placed over the existing chain link.

Proposal by Cllr Brawn to go ahead with the pvc coated fence at £66.58 per roll (2 rolls required & cable clips extra), seconded Cllr Cole, carried.

The above was duly **resolved**.

15/032 Honorary Service Award- to resolve 2015 recipient. .

Proposal by Cllr Cocks to nominate Andrew & Sandra Waters for their work supporting Charities throughout the Parish including Fraddon Village Hall & Summercourt Memorial Hall, prescription pick up service, and Andrew's time on both the Parish and District Councils, seconded Cllr Cole, unanimous. The above was duly **resolved.**

Andy, our current contractor from Cormac is being made redundant on 28th March 2015. Andy is going self- employed carrying out the same service he does now, ensuring the play areas are safe before he leaves. Cormac will be continuing with the inspection service but any issues will be notified to the Clerk.

Proposal by Cllr Pickles that St Enoder would be minded to change to Andy but need a quote in writing and query what will happen when he is on holiday, seconded Cllr Cole, unanimous.
