I would also like to take this opportunity to thank Councillor Cole, who represents us as a Cornwall and Parish Councillor who tirelessly works on our behalf, he is committed, very hard working and approachable and I am grateful for all the work he does in our community, which is never ending. Some of the projects that have been completed to date so far have been the introduction of the speed bumps by Indian Queens School and the crossings on Chapel Road and Francis Road, which seems to have calmed down the speed of the traffic, this has been an ongoing problem with speeding traffic in the village for a very long time. Along with the warning signs approaching the village of speeding traffic should make a considerable difference and hopefully more safety for our children and elderly. There has been landscaping completed on the open space near the Indian Queens School with the installation of bins and benches. There has also been a Community Orchard that has been planted with thanks to the Tree Council for the grant and thanks to Indian Queens School with the children planting. The success of the Youth Club gave rise for a grant application being submitted to build an extension which has been successful. Planning permission has been approved and the building works are due to start soon.

The Parish Council has agreed to improve allotment provision with an additional field due to be turned into allotments soon, this well help with the long waiting list we have of people waiting for an allotment. At the moment we still have a vacancy for one Councillor and if any of you would like to come forward for that position we would welcome you on board. If you are interested please get in touch with the Parish Clerk.

On a final note, September saw the loss of our beloved Queen Elizabeth II and much of our nation having just celebrated her platinum anniversary soon went into mourning. We are soon to see a new chapter open with the Coronation of HM King Charles III next month, a day to celebrate a new beginning and hopefully happier times.
