## Chairman's Report 2024-25

2024/25 has yet again been busy with planning applications and Parish projects.

Indian Queens Recreational Ground has seen improvements to the access road by fixing potholes and upgrades to the drainage for the toilets. Work has also been undertaken to the internal plumbing of all the buildings and now the water system is regularly checked for legionella to safeguard the users of the facilities.

In Summercourt the play equipment at Thomas Playing Field has at last been refurbished by the suppliers, thanks to the hard work of Cllr Cole and Cllr Kessell. Both have spent many frustrated hours on the phone and in the park to ensure the equipment is at last how we wish it to be. We have also had ball-stop fencing installed behind the goals and the contractors who did the work should be complemented on a very tidy and professional install.

With regards to Village Halls, the Victory Hall has received a new floor from the Parish Council and Fraddon new Fire Doors have been approved, install is early April.

Parking and speeding seems to be an ongoing issue within all areas of the Parish but at least with the new speed limits and the speed awareness signs we can only hope for improvements.

With the changes in Planning Rules brought in by the new Government and the pressure on energy security all the Parish Councils in the vicinity are under constant pressure from green developments. With that in mind, may I ask Parishioners to voice their view and take advantage of the public sessions at these meetings, as it is too late to complain once the decision has been taken and the area we live changed forever.

Finally some thanks to Alan Shaw, my predecessor as Chairman, and good luck in his new job. Cornwall Cllr Dick Cole for his hard work in securing grant funding for projects, helping residents with planning and other problems they may have. Amanda Kendall, our Parish Clerk, who is the glue that holds everything together, for her hard work behind and in front of the scenes.
