Chairman's Report 2020-21



The last year has been like no other, not only for the Parish Council but for our lives in general. As I write this report, we are still in grip of COVID-19, as a result, we have had to do council business differently.

Council Meetings and the ability as councillors to meet face to face has been curtailed. Currently we continue our daily business via emails, phone calls and zoom - a video communication platform.

This year we are planning to hold local elections in May, this includes both Cornwall Council and Parish Council Elections. This will be followed by our Parish Council Annual Meeting when the position of Chair, Vice Chair and councillors are agreed. I am happy, as always to represent St. Enoder.

The referendum for the St. Enoder Neighbourhood plan which should have been held in 2020 will now be held in the summer of this year.

Our youth club has continued during the pandemic with regular zoom meetings. There has been no progress on our intention to open a junior youth club owing to COVID-19.

The Parish Council would like to thank all the volunteers who stepped forward to help vulnerable people access deliveries of food and medicines during this time. In particular thanks go to Cornwall Councillor Dick Cole and Parish Council Clerk Amanda Kendall for coordinating and undertaking prescription deliveries, having been registered as the local parish hub with Volunteer Cornwall.

The Tour of Britain cycle race will be taking place first weekend in September this year having been postponed from 2020. It will be coming through Summercourt on 5th September.

Works that have been completed this year are as follows:-

- A mobile speed camera has been purchased and has been used in various locations in the Parish.
- In 2016 we purchased additional land to enlarge the Indian Queens Cemetery. I am pleased to report, that the work has now been completed; this has involved installing Cornish Hedging and extra drainage, pathways and a road for the use of vehicles etc.
- We have installed streetlights on the lane leading to the Recreation Ground. This was completed by September 2020. This included replacement of floodlights and their brackets.

Works that are currently in progress:-

- The transfer of land from Cornwall Council to the Parish to enable us to provide a new footway between Harvenna Heights and Indian Queens School.
- Cornwall Councillor Dick Cole has secured a £10,000 grant, to enable us to provide public toilets, including facilities for the disabled, on the Indian Queens Recreation Ground. we aim to have the work completed by the end of the year 2021.

- We have accepted quotes to repair the wall around St. Ender Church Old Cemetery and to repair the concrete plinth around the War Memorial.
