Chairman's Report 2021-22



Well, another year over and Covid appears to still be affecting our lives in one way or another, but we are learning to live with this virus and trying to have some normality in our day to day lives. It has been a long two years and let's hope times are now going to get easier for all of us.

I took over as Chairman from Michael Bunyan in May 2021, who did five very successful years and on behalf of the Parish Council I would like to thank Michael for his time, that was so well spent and he is a very hard act to follow.

There are some ongoing projects that are occurring or have already occurred in the Parish, the wall has been rebuilt in the Old St Enoder Cemetery which looks so much better along with the plinth repair to the War Memorial. We now have 2 additional mobile speed signs bringing our total to 3. These will be moved around the Parish to monitor the speeds of cars throughout the Parish.

A great asset to the Indian Queens Recreational Field has been the provision of the new public toilets. Thank you to Cllr Cole for obtaining a grant towards the cost. There have been new benches installed at Indian Queens Pit Open Space, to provide much needed additional seating.

The Parish Council has also taken over the Open Space next to the school and a new footpath has been installed from Harvenna Heights with self-closing gates installed, the hedge has also been rebuilt Harvenna Heights end. This project will be ongoing once the area has dried out along with fencing being installed.

The youth club is growing in numbers and goes from strength to strength and there is a possibility of putting on an extra night or an extension to the building as there are restrictions on numbers. So, after Covid, the youth club has gone from strength to strength and long may it continue to do so.

We had elections in May and still have 2 vacancies on the Parish Council, should anyone wish to join us then please contact Amanda our Parish Clerk or if you have any questions give Amanda a call and she will answer those questions for you. We would make you more than welcome and support you in every way possible to make it a smooth transition.
